THANKSGIVING - FROM A 10 YEAR OLD, BUT GOING ON 15!

We were shocked to read the sins of Sodom recorded in Ezekiel 16 as "pride, laziness, and too much food, while the **poor and needy suffered outside her door**". The WBC Church is not sitting idly by while those outside suffer!. Through the "give away fund" and those who are now moving out to various parts of our world, God is at work! We in Quicken Trust now recall 10 years of God at work in Kabubbu.

Some ask us for details on Trusts who may give them large sums of money. A Bishop drove all day from Nairobi for a copy of our development plan- we have neither! But for 10 years our amazing God has cared for, and daily feeds 1,025 people in Kabubbu.

At a thanksgiving Service in Kabubbu Church a queue formed ...1st in line was Jacqueline 15, you may remember her because of the appalling facial scars she has as a result of a house fire in which she became an orphan, she thanked God for....going to school! 2nd came a Moslem teacher she spoke of needing a life saving caesarean op, but it was too dangerous to operate and so the nurses prayed with her. Moments later her blood pressure dropped, and staff operated and as a result she is now a Christian! 3rd a Christian teacher praised God for sparing her life despite losing her baby!

4th a driver told how he came to faith through the Alpha course! 5th a woman spoke of how God transformed her alcoholic husband....God continues to do incredible things!

How has God done it? His miraculous provision has not come from wealthy donors or Grant making Trusts but sacrificial gifts of £10 or £20 often from pensioners, part time workers, and those on limited incomes, plus the prayers of many!

What else happened in Kabubbu in April?

*A Moslem student became a Christian- but his Grandma now makes his life difficult!

*Two Pastors have now started Bible training courses!

*An AIDS victim & refugee without money or support was given transport to go 100 miles home. He had not seen his wife & kids for 2 years & he wanted to die at home!

* We heard stories from 2 elderly ladies who witnessed rape & murder under Obote's rule and who simply said "God saved my life"
